LawHub	-	\$0 or \$120/year	
<p>LawHub provides access to official LSAT practice tests in the same format as the actual LSAT. There are two options: LawHub and LawHub Advantage. LawHub is free and offers roughly 4 practice tests. LawHub Advantage is \$120/year and offers 58 practice tests. Eligible applicants may receive a fee waiver from LSAC for LawHub Advantage.</p>			
LSAT Preparation Books and Services	-	\$0-\$1,500+	
<p>LSAT takers prepare for the test in several different ways. Some test takers prepare using only practice tests. Others make use of books, courses, and private tutoring. The majority of test takers use multiple methods of preparation.</p>			
LSAT (with Writing Sample)		\$238	
<p>Law school applicants often take the LSAT more than once. Applicants typically take the LSAT 2-3 times, but some applicants take it additional times. Eligible applicants may receive a fee waiver from LSAC for one or two LSAT attempts, depending on the fee waiver received.</p>			
Credential Assembly Service (CAS)	-	\$207	
<p>Most law schools require applicants to submit their law school applications through LSAC's Credential Assembly Service. Eligible applicants may receive a fee waiver from LSAC for this service.</p>			
Transcript Requests		generally \$0-\$35	
<p>With a few exceptions, official transcripts from every educational institution attended must be submitted directly to LSAC by the institution. Fees for transcript requests vary by institution.</p>			
CAS Law School Reports		\$45	
<p>Each law school application requires a CAS Law School Report. Eligible applicants may receive a fee waiver from LSAC for three or six reports, depending on the fee waiver received. Individual law schools may also provide applicants with fee waivers.</p>			
Application Fees		\$0-\$90	
<p>Application fees vary by law school. Individual law schools may provide applicants with fee waivers.</p>			
Total			
<p>Without any fee waivers, a typical applicant is likely to spend around \$1,350 for everything that goes into the first law school application and \$85 for each additional application.</p>
