Required for All Applications

Component	Completed	Notes
LSAT or Other Test Score(s)		
		The LSAT is accepted by every law school accredited by the American Bar Association (ABA) and is generally preferred over other standardized tests. However, some law schools will accept scores from other standardized tests, mainly the GRE.
Transcript(s)		
		Applicants must have transcripts sent directly to LSAC from each undergraduate and graduate institution the applicant has attended or is currently attending.
Resume		
		Applicants will need to provide law schools with a list of past work experience, typically in the form of a resume. Applicants may also include previous volunteer experience.
Application Form(s)		
		Each law school uses its own application form to collect information from applicants. These applications can be accessed through LSAC's website.

Diversity Statement			
<p>Law schools are interested in increasing the diversity of their student populations. An applicant who can contribute to this goal can include a diversity statement describing how the applicant could help promote diversity at the school.</p>			
Optional Essay(s)			
<p>Some law schools provide (an) additional essay prompt(s) to which applicants have the option of responding. These essays can strengthen an applicant's application but are not required.</p>			
GPA Addendum			
<p>In some cases, an applicant may wish to include a GPA addendum that provides context for the applicant's overall GPA or GPA during a specific period of time in the applicant's educational history.</p>			
LSAT Addendum			
<p>In some cases, an applicant may wish to include an LSAT addendum that provides context for the applicant's LSAT score(s).</p>
